**PHARMACOLOGICAL PROPERTIES:-** HERVOTE is an oral contraceptive pill. Oral contraceptives, also known as “birth-control pills” or “the pill,” are taken to prevent pregnancy, and when taken correctly, have a failure rate of less than 1% per year when used without missing any pills.

**INDICATION:** Taken to prevent pregnancy **DOSAGE AND ADMINISTRATION:** - . Take one pill at

the same time every day until the pack is empty. Do not skip pills even if you are spotting or bleeding between monthly periods or feel sick to your stomach (nausea). Do not skip pills even if you do not have sex very often. **CONTRAINDICATION:** If you have vomiting or diarrhea, or if you take some

medicines, including some antibiotics and some herbal products such as St. John's Wort, your pills may not work as well. Use a back-up method (such as condoms or spermicides) until you check with your doctor or healthcare provider. **WARNINGS & PRECAUTIONS:** Cigarette smoking increases the risk of

serious adverse effects on the heart and blood vessels from oral contraceptive use. This risk increases with age and with heavy smoking (15 or more cigarettes per day) and is quite marked in women over 35 years of age. Women who use oral contraceptives should not smoke. You should not take the pill if you have

history of kidney or sever liver diseases. Drospirenone may increase potassium level in body hence HERVOTE should not be taken if you have heart, kidney or renal diseases. The risk of developing certain serious diseases that can be life threatening or may cause temporary or permanent disability or death

increases in the women having high blood pressure, diabetes, clotting disorders, stroke, and cancer of the breast or sex organs, jaundice, malignant or benign liver tumors. **DRUG INTERACTIONS:** some antibiotics and herbal medicines **ADVERSE REACTIONS:** light bleeding, vomiting, diarrhea and fever.
